1). Important Things to Note:

- a). The RAND HRS 2006 Fat File is based on HRS 2006 Core (Final V4.0, August 2021) data, and the Tracker 2006 (V1.0, October 2007) file.
- b). The RAND HRS 2006 Fat File (V4B) corrects an issue for Respondent preloads KZ087 and KZ089, as well as the Respondent data model KVDATE, which were being overwritten by household module variables. This is corrected and the household preload variables have been added and renamed as KX087 and KX089 following the naming convention established in the HRS 2014 Core data.

Please note, however, that these documents are unlike traditional codebooks in the sense that they do not contain information about specific variables from the survey (e.g., frequencies, question text, etc.). The Health and Retirement Study (HRS) is a longitudinal household survey conducted by the Institute for Social Research at the University of Michigan with funding from the National Institute on Aging (grant numbers NIA U01AG009740) and the Social Security Administration. The HRS is extraordinarily rich and complex, and its multidisciplinary data provide researchers the opportunity to investigate many different aspects related to population aging in the United States. With the goal of making the data more accessible to researchers, the RAND Center for the Study of Aging, with funding and support from the National Institute on Aging (NIA) and the Social Security Administration (SSA), has created the RAND HRS data products. This document describes the RAND HRS 2020 Fat File.
